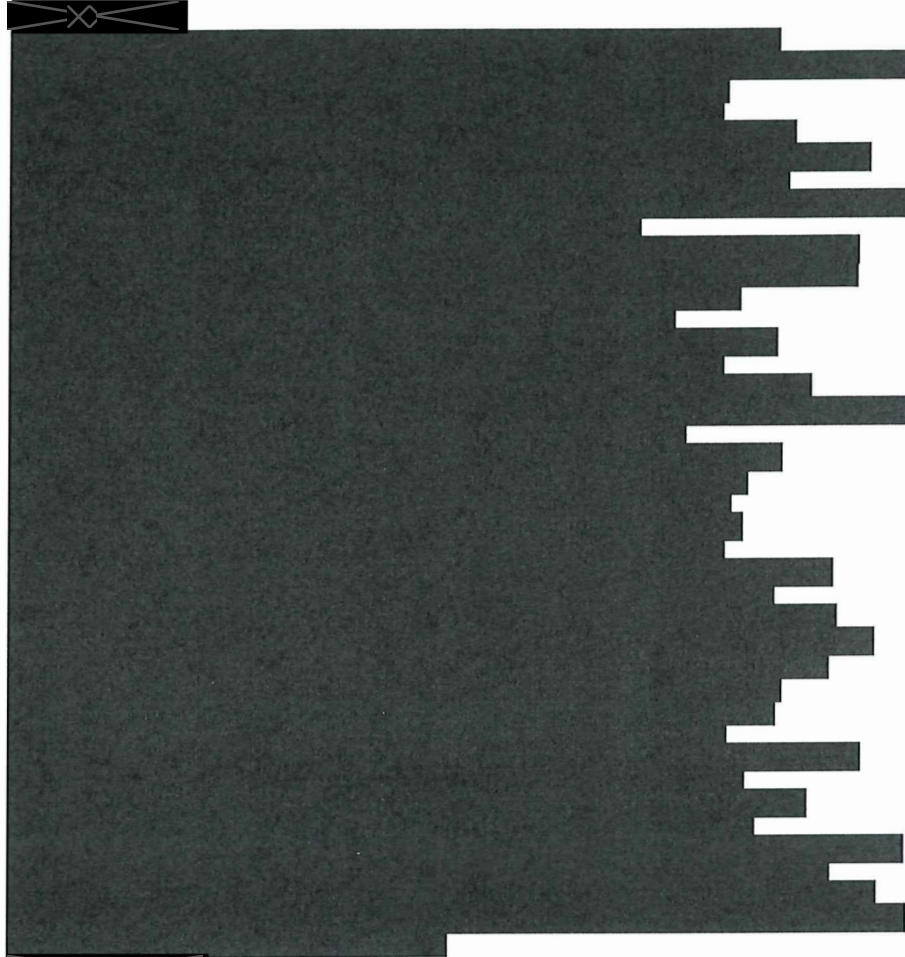

Dear EED Expert Group Members,
Dear Energy Attachés,

Hope all is well.

Allow me to come back to you with some updated on the ongoing work for data centres, in accordance with Article 12 of the EED recast and the Delegated Regulation 2024/1364:

- The functionality to use files to upload or download reported data was activated in mid-January. To simplify things, all accounts that were created before 16 January were automatically updated to include the role of "EED DC Data Uploader". Accounts created after that date will need to actively ask for this option, as described in the FAQ.
- While the reporting for the 2024 period is still open, Member States coordinators should have started seeing the "SUBMIT" button being active in their accounts. Simply put, if a Member State decides that reporting for 2024 is over (at the best of its knowledge), the coordinator can submit the data, effectively freezing reporting for 2024 and data centres in its territory. Allow me to recall that a Member State can still request a reopening of the 2024 reporting if there are reasons for it.
- At the same time, the opening of the reporting for the 2025 period is under preparaion. The

deadline for the 2025 reporting is 15 May, so it would be important to give enough time for a proper reporting by all data centres and Member States.

As a reminder, the 2025 reporting refers to the annual data of the whole 2024. Please note that the 2025 reporting will take place in parallel to the 2024 one, so the fact that Member State submitting the data or not in one reporting period does not affect the other one.

- A last point on reporting. In accordance with Article 5(5) of the Delegated Regulation, the Commission and Member States authorities are obliged to keep confidential all information and key performance indicators for individual data centres that are communicated to the database. It is really important to reiterate this point as the Commission has already received various requests for access to documents by the media or the public in relation to the data. All these requests have been so far refused. The Commission is working to prepare the presentation of the aggregated data described in Annex IV of the Delegated Regulation.
- In addition, it is also important to reassure all stakeholders that the European database is developed and located within the IT perimeter of the European Commission, in accordance with the highest standards of security and handling of sensitive data.
- Finally, some information on the next steps on this work. You will soon receive an invitation for the first workshop (indicative date: 11 February 2025, 10:00 CET) that will set the scene and kick-off the consultation process for the rating scheme and the possible minimum performance standards for data centres.
